

Google Classroom API Share Button

The Google Classroom share button allows teachers to post the BLC resources directly into their Google Classroom classes.

Share button API configuration steps:





Upload the HTML5 version of the BLC resource(s) to a Web server.

For viewing purposes, create a **hyperlink to the BLC resource** on a webpage where you think it will be the most effective (e.g. staff intranet).

User	Description & user guides
Students	Students can set their own targets
All Tutors	Tutors can set targets for their students
Pastoral Coach/Personal Tutor	Target Setting and Monitoring, SMART Presentation, SMART Parget Poster
Student resource	Preview 'Setting SMART Targets'. Click the Google Classroom icon below to add the online resource directly into your class.

Add the **Classroom share button** next to, or below the preview link (see STEP 3)



The easiest method for including a Classroom share button on your page is to include the necessary JavaScript resource

<script src="https://apis.google.com/js/platform.js" async defer></script>

and to add a share button tag.

Configure the API code: copy and paste the code below (change the URL to point to the resource on your Web server)
